IBEW RATIFIES AGREEMENT WITH UNITED SPACE ALLIANCE

KENNEDY SPACE CENTER, FL (June 25, 2007) -- United Space Alliance (USA) has reached agreement with its Florida employees represented by the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW), Local No. 2088.

Employees represented by IBEW voted to ratify their collective bargaining agreement on Saturday.
